

Referencias indirectas

indirection, indirect references

usar el valor de una variable para acceder al contenido de otra

```
# declaramos 2 variables
export xyzzy=plugh ; export plugh=cave

echo ${xyzzy} # normal, xyzzy to plugh -> plugh

echo ${!xyzzy} # indirection, xyzzy to plugh to cave -> cave
```

existen 2 casos en el que este comportamiento se ve modificado:

- `${!N*}` : muestra las variables que empiecen por N
- `${!name[@]}`

```
export myVar="hi"
echo ${!my*} # myVar

export ${!my*}="bye"
echo $myVar # bye
```

asignación a variable referenciada indirectamente

```
#!/bin/bash

AQUI_VALOR="GHJGHJGHJ"
VARIABLE=AQUI_VALOR

read -p "Valor: " VALOR
echo ${VALOR}

declare "${VARIABLE}=$VALOR"
# typeset equivalente a declare, soportado por otros shells (zsh)
# printf -v "${VARIABLE} '%s'" "${VALOR}"

echo $AQUI_VALOR # $VALOR
echo "=="
echo $VARIABLE # $VARIABLE
```
